The ability to speak, read, write, and understand another language is increasingly valuable in today's world. A German minor is an excellent complement to virtually any major. UW-Superior's German program introduces students to the German language and the culture of the German-speaking nations. Courses enable students to lay the groundwork for fluency in German and to enhance practical language skills for specific career purposes.

This program includes a special study abroad opportunity offered in conjunction with UW-Superior's cooperating institution in Oldenburg, Germany. Programs in the state of Hessen (Wisconsin's sister state in Germany) are available, particularly in the medieval city of Marburg. Many special programs are also available, including, international social work in Fulda and international business in Kassel. Partial study abroad scholarship funding is automatically provided to all German minors, including the short term programs in summer and J-term.

Teacher certification requires study abroad. Students may also create an Individualized Major in German Studies by adding an extended study abroad experience.

The German Program is taught by Dr. Timothy Crow who has studied at the University of Cologne in Germany and who has published on various aspects of German language and culture. Dr. Crow completed his Ph.D. in German at Ohio State University.
