UW-Superior offers an Elementary Education major to prepare teachers certified to teach birth through age 11 or age 6 through 13. Many of the courses for Elementary Education certification can be completed through online or independent coursework. Some courses must be taken on campus or through other distance education programs, and students are expected to complete their student teaching requirement in Wisconsin, or adjacent areas of Minnesota traditionally served by the University of Wisconsin - Superior.

UW-Superior's Teacher Education program offers a challenging curriculum, involving work with children in your local community and as a student teacher or teaching intern. The program prepares students for licensure in Wisconsin and is acceptable for licensure in many other states.

Each Elementary Education major also completes a teaching minor. The following minors can be completed at a distance by coursework at UW-Superior or by combining coursework at UW-Superior with coursework from other distance education institutions:

- Early Education
- Geography
- Health Education
- Library Science - initial school library media certification
- English Language Arts
- Social Studies

After earning a bachelor's degree, you can continue your education and professional growth throughout your career with our high-quality graduate programs in reading, instruction, special education, counseling, and educational administration.

Program Highlights

- Most coursework can be completed without leaving your home, community, or job. Two co-requisite courses, requiring attendance on campus, are offered during the summer session.
- Coursework is directed by faculty members in the Teacher Education Program, all of whom have public school teaching experience.
- Each student has an academic advisor to offer guidance in selecting courses and choosing a minor or second minor.
