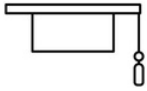


# Career Readiness Skills

Identify and respond to needs based upon an understanding of situational context and logical analysis of relevant information.



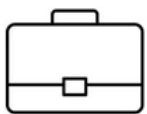
## EQUITY & INCLUSION
